TITLE: How To Get Fired By Doing A Great Job

BACKGROUND: This fast paced keynote will challenge the audience to look at their own job activities and to evaluate how they might be doing everything that they think is the right thing and yet be on course to be terminated by the organization. Our own perception of job performance is only one of a variety of factors that go into job security and success.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: The attendees should go back to the workplace and their personal lives with a clear understanding of the issues that could be putting them and their career in jeopardy. They will leave with the questions that they need to ask themselves to determine if they are doing so well at their job that they are running directly to the exit door. They will want to take these ideas back to change the way they feel, believe and behave each day of their lives.
